1. Programme structure (Diploma/MA)

- (a) The programme is available for study in full-time and part-time modes.
- (b) The period of study for full-time mode shall be one year starting in September. The period of study for part-time mode shall normally be two years starting in September.
- (c) The programme comprises modules to a credit value of 120 for diploma; 180 for MA
- (d) All candidates shall take the following compulsory modules:

With prior approval from the DPD, it will be possible for part-time students to take the compulsory modules in a different order, as long as all compulsory modules are still studied.

Candidates taking the programme wishing to obtain combined RTPI accreditation after completing BA Urban Planning (K421) or as part of the BA Architecture and Urban Planning (K190) and Certificate in Planning Practice (3038U) accredited pathway will be required to take, and pass, a version of 'The Reflexive Practitioner' module in place of TCP8090 'Principles and Practice of Urban Design' (which, however, they are advised to observe for their learning). For K421 graduates this is TCP8902 and for K190/3038U graduates this is TCP8942.

2. Assessment methods

3. Progression Requirements

For progression on to the Thesis or Dissertation element of the MA in Urban Design ARC8117), students must pass ARC8069 Housing Alternatives at the first submission. Those who fail to do so will only be eligible to continue on the programme for resubmission of this failed module for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Urban Design only. Students in this situation will not be allowed to undertake ARC8117 Design Thesis or Dissertation.

4. Transfer from Diploma (3359) to MA (4004)

With DPD approval, students who achieve a semester 1 average of over 60% on the Diploma (3359) will be allowed to transfer to the MA Urban Design (4004) at the beginning of Semester 2.

(c) Students who have completed the MArch (5843F) will be granted admission to the MA/Diploma Urban Design on consideration of previous modules studied as part of the MArch; and may be granted up to 40 credits worth of Credit Transfer if MA /Diploma Urban Design compulsory modules have been previously studied, and passed, as part of the MArch.

(d) Students admitted to MA/Diploma Urban Design from the MArch as above, will have their final classification for this award calculated using all 180 credits of MA Urban Design modules studied or 120 credits for the Diploma. As such, the grades achieved in the Urban Design modules studied as part of the MArch, whose credits are transferred to the MA/Diploma Urban Design.

6. Exemptions from the University's Qualifications and Credit Framework and the University Regulations

An exemption from the University Regulations has been agreed which specifies that the design module (ARC8069) must be passed at first attempt for students to be allowed to proceed to their design dissertation. Students not allowed to proceed to the dissertation can still resit ARC8069 and obtain a postgraduate diploma.
