In the case of students who have not demonstrated the potential to succeed on the full programme, or who choose not to continue on the full programme at the end of 12 months, or where the progress of the student is deemed unsatisfactory at subsequent stages, they may be considered for the award of: (a) a PG Certificate in Landscape Design Studies (if they have successfully passed 60 credits of taught modules), (b) a PG Diploma in Landscape Design Studies (if they have successfully passed 120 credits of taught modules); (c) a Master of Arts in Landscape Design Studies (if they have successfully passed 180 credits of taught modules).
