1. Programme Structure

- (a) The programme is available for study in part-time blended learning mode only.
- (b) Recognition of Prior Learning is in line with University policy.
- (c) The period of study for part-time blended learning mode for the MSc Coaching and Mentoring shall normally be 24 months. Once the programme is established, it will have two cohort intakes per year, in September and January.
- (d) The programme comprises modules to a credit value of 180.

- a) Candidates are normally expected to pass the taught element of the programme, including the Practice-Based Research Methods module, before progressing to the Challenging Practice Through Research module.
- b) A student who fails up to 20 credits of modules of the programme is recommended, as of right, for the award of the Master's in Science degree in Coaching and Mentoring, provided that no single mark for any module assessed is below 40 and the weighted average mark for all modules (taking credit values into account) is at least 50. Such a student will be eligible as of right only for the award of a pass classification.
