- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.*

## 3. Year 3 (Placement Year)

On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates may as part of their studies for the degree spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete the placement year.

NB: Placement opportunities will be guided by governmental and institutional policy at the time.

(c) With the approval of the Degree Programme Director students may choose alternative optional modules (up to 20 credits) from stages 2 or 3. This will require a clear rationale and the selection of a stage 2 module is expected to be exceptional rather than the norm. Students must accumulate a minimum of 90 taught credits at FHEQ Level 6 to qualify for the award of Bachelor of Arts with Honours.

(d) \*SOC3085 (Exchange module) allows students to study in semester 1 of Stage 3 in a European University where they will take modules that count towards their final degree and begin work on their dissertation. Students wishing to take this module must indicate their interest in Stage 2.

#### 5. Assessment methods

Details of the assessment pattern for each module are explained in the module outline.

#### 6. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:2 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

## **7. Degree title**

Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year shall be transferred onto the four year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1492U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in Sociology (with Placement Year).
