Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year.

- (d) Candidates wishing to take any of the Exchange modules may do so, subject to agreeing an overall set of modules with the Degree Programme Director such that they maintain the balance between Politics and Economics.
- (e) With the approval of the Degree Programme Director alternative optional modules (up to 20 credits) to those listed above may be selected, including NCL Career Development and Enterprise modules.

5. Assessment methods

6. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:2 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

7. Degree title

Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year shall be transferred onto the four year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1462U and will graduate with a BA (hons) in Politics and Economics (with Placement Year).
