### 4. Placement Year (Year 3)

- (a) On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates may spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation as part of their studies for the degree. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year.

## 8. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:2 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

## 9. Degree title

Candidates who complete the three-year programme will graduate with a BA (Hons) in History. Candidates who choose to take part in the Study Abroad year will be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1463U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in History (with Study Abroad). Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year will be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1466U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in History (with Placement Year)

Candidates who study abroad for one year after completion of Stage 3 will be transferred onto 1702U and will graduate with a Bachelor of Arts with Honours in History (with Year Abroad)
