- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.*
- (vii) *Candidates are required to participate in approved excavations, fieldwork or other practical work of at least two weeks' duration at the end of Stage 1 and at least two weeks' duration at the end of Stage 2, either in each of the two long vacations during the degree programme, or at other times specified by the Degree Programme Director. Students needing to postpone their Stage 1 or Stage 2 fieldwork must have the written approval of the fieldwork co-ordinator.*
- (viii) *You may not take more than 70 credits in any one semester (thus, your credit balance over two semesters must be 60/60 or 70/50)*

6. Degree Classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:2 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

7. Degree Title

Candidates who complete the three-year programme will graduate with a BA (Hons) in Archaeology. Candidates who choose to take part in the Study Abroad year will be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1615U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in Archaeology (with Study Abroad).
