2. Assessment methods

3. Transfer into Stage 2 of Master Landscape Architecture (MLA) (4157F)

Students who pass all modules at first attempt in Semester 1 and Semester 2 are eligible to transfer into Stage 2 the Master of Landscape Architecture (MLA) programme at the end of Semester 2, with the approval of the MLA Degree Programme Director. This pathway will only be open to students who take TCP8096 and TCP8097. Students who fail a semester 1 module may be given the opportunity to resubmit during semester 2 as a second and final attempt. Please note this is earlier than the normal resubmission period and students do so at their own risk, should the module be fail at second and final attempt students would no longer be considered for a transfer to Master Landscape Architecture (MLA) (4157F).
