‡ Candidates, who have not taken SEL1000, should approach the module leader for permission before choosing this module. Note that this module is a preferred prerequisite for SEL2224, SEL2226, SEL2227 or SEL2228 (see next note).

* Candidates ideally need to have taken SEL1000 (Introduction to Creative Writing) at Stage 1 and SEL2215 (Creative Practice) at Stage 2 (Semester 1), in order to take **SEL2224, SEL2226, SEL2227 or SEL2228**. However, if they feel they can demonstrate capacity in this area (e.g. a portfolio of good quality work), they may also approach the Module Leader directly for permission to join. This should be done BEFORE choosing any of these modules. Further, any one of these Stage 2 modules must be taken by any student, who wishes subsequently to take one of the Stage 3 creative writing 40-credit modules, SEL3400 (Prose Portfolio), SEL3401 (Theatre Script Portfolio), SEL3402 (Poetry Portfolio), or SEL3403 (Screenwriting Portfolio).

3. Year 3 (Intercalating Year)

On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates may as part of their studies for the degree spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director.

Similarly, with the approval of the Degree Programme Director, a candidate (dependent upon which passport they hold) may spend one year studying abroad at a partner institution. Unlike the one-semester exchanges described above [2(e)], however, it should be noted that, although candidates must pass any course of study taken, the results will NOT contribute to their final degree classification.

NB: Placement opportunities will be guided by national and institutional policy at the time.

5. Assessment methods

6. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3, with the weighting of the stages being 2:1 for Stage 3 and Stage 2 respectively. The Intercalating Year must be passed if taken, but does not affect degree classification.

7. Appendix: Classical Language Pathways for Q800, Q810, QQ83 and V110

- (a) Greek and Latin are taught in four pathways (e). Candidates taking Classical language modules (f) shall follow pathway A or B or C or D, depending on their level at entry (to be determined by the Degree Programme Director, in consultation with the candidate if necessary):

- A. Intermediate level at Stage 1
- B. Beginners' level at Stage 1
- C. Beginners' level at Stage 2 (not available to Q800)
- D. Beginners' level at Stage 3 (not available to Q800)

- (b) All candidates except those in Q800 may terminate or pause any of these pathways at any point.
- (c) Once on a pathway, students may not repeat a module, skip a module, return to an earlier point, or switch to a different pathway. However, suitable variations to any of these pathways may be permitted for cause at the discretion of the Degree Programme Director.
- (d) An exemption from the University's Qualifications and Credit Framework has been granted to allow the study of Beginners' and Intermediate Latin and Greek at any stage. In the cases of Stages 2 and 3, the particular pathway selected is subject to the discretion of the Degree Programme director.
