- (i) These programme regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's Taught Programme Regulations.
- (ii) A core module is a module which a student must pass.
- (iii) A compulsory module is a module which a student is required to study.
- (iv) All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.

1. Programme structure

- (a) The programme is available for study in both full-time and part-time modes. The part-time programme must be agreed in consultation with, and with the approval of, the Degree Programme Director
- (b) The period of study for full-time mode shall be 1 year starting in September. The period of study for part-time mode shall normally be 2 years starting in September.
- (c) The programme comprises modules to a credit value of 180 (or, if the candidate takes 40 credits of sub-level 7 credits as language options, 190).
- (d) Candidates are required to choose a pathway which must be selected from the two pathways available, Classics or Ancient History. All assessed work, including the Dissertation, will be within the chosen pathway.
- (e) **All candidates** shall take the following **compulsory** modules:

- (j) Candidates who choose the Ancient History Pathway shall normally (though discretion may be exercised by the Degree Programme Director) take **one** of the following modules if two options were taken from (h) or 1 combination of modules if only one option was chosen from (h), depending on their choice of Greek or Latin, and on their level in that language at entry, to be determined by the Degree Programme Director (in consultation with the candidate).
- (k) Candidates who choose the Classics Pathway shall take **two** of the following modules or 1 combination of modules, depending on their choice of Greek or Latin, and on their level in that language at entry, to be determined by the Degree Programme Director (in consultation with the candidate).

- (l) Students undertaking 40 credits of sub-Level 7 language modules require a further 10 Level 7 credits in order to meet the threshold of 150 Level 7 credits required for a Masters degree in the UK. Those students must take the following module in Semester 2 that will allow them to apply their language skills (of whatever ability) to the needs of their academic programme. It is only to be taken by students registered for 40 credits of ancient or modern languages.
