- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.*
- (vii) *With the approval of the Degree Programme Director, and in exceptional circumstances, an alternative combination of modules that fall out with these regulations may be selected.*

1. Stage 1

**SEL2210 is an independent study module in English Literature or a related subject (film/theatre). The Independent Research Project is only open to students who are also taking 60 credits of taught modules in Literature at Stage 2, as described in lists (d) and (e). SEL2210 is a prerequisite for the Dissertation: Long-Form Essay at stage 3 (SEL3362). Students wishing to take this module should meet with the Subject Head for Creative Writing.*

3. Year 3 (Placement Year)

On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates may as part of their studies for the degree spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year.

6. Degree title

Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year shall be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1546U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in English Language and Creative Writing (with Placement Year).

7. Degree classification

- (i) All Stage 2 and Stage 3 modules contribute towards the degree classification.
- (ii) Stage 2 and Stage 3 will be weighted in the ratio 1:2 in the final degree calculation.

8. University Study Abroad and Exchange Programme

- (a) Pending Degree Programme Director approval, students may take part in a semester abroad as listed in the School Undergraduate Handbook. The study abroad programme and the grades obtained are integral to the final degree. Students who take part in a semester abroad will be assigned one of the below modules codes.
