#### 1. Programme structure

- (a) The programme is available for study in both full-time and part-time modes.
- (b) The period of study for full-time mode shall be 12 months starting in September. The period of study for part-time mode shall normally be 24 months starting in September.
- (c) The programme comprises modules to a credit value of 180.
