- (iii) *Unless otherwise stated under 'Type', modules are not core.*
- (iv) *A compulsory module is a module which a student is required to study.*
- (v) *A core module is a module which a student must pass, and in which a fail mark may neither be carried nor compensated; such modules are designated by the board of studies as essential for progression to a further stage of the programme or for study in a further module.*
- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning. With the approval of the Degree Programme Director, and in exceptional circumstances, an alternative combination of modules that fall out with these regulations may be selected.*

#### 1. Stage 1

- (a) All candidates will study 120 credits. Candidates will normally study 60 credits in each semester. In particular circumstances they may, however, study 50 credits in one semester and 70 credits in the other.

## **5. Residence Abroad**

Candidates are required to insert, between Stage 2 and Stage 4, a year spent in an approved Spanish-speaking country, either pursuing a course of study at a university or other comparable institution, or undertaking an approved work placement. In exceptional circumstances, this requirement may be waived with permission by the Degree Programme Director.

Travel and study abroad will be guided by institutional policy and governmental guidance at the time.

## **7. Degree classification**

- (i) The marks from Stages 2 and 4 will contribute to the final classification of the degree.
- (ii) Stage 2 and Stage 4 will be weighted in the ratio 1:2 in the final degree calculation.
- (iii) If the mark gained in SML3006/3007/3008 at Stage 3 is equal to or greater than the average mark from modules taken at Stage 2 within the School of English Literature, Language and Linguistics, then the mark from the former will be substituted for the marks gained in the lowest 20 credits of modules taken with the School of English at Stage 2 when calculating the degree average and overall profile of marks.
