Notes

- (i) These programme regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's Research Masters Degree Regulations.
- (ii) A core module is a module which a student must pass and in which a fail mark may not be compensated; such modules are designated by the board of studies as essential.
- (iii) A compulsory module is a module which a student must take.
- (iv) All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.
- (v) As a Research Masters degree, this programme reflects specific research themes and aims incorporating research preparation. The programme comprises at least 180 credits of which at least 80 credits will be dedicated to the research project/dissertation.
- (vi) As a research degree, the Master of Music consists of at least 80 credits of research-based modules. 'Research' is here defined as independent study which may include a dissertation, the creative project, or a combination of 'elective project' modules (for instance, in performance, musicology or composition). The content and scope of each project, as well as the timing and number of assessments arising from it, will be agreed between the candidate and their supervisor and ratified by board of studies. Candidates may take up to a maximum of 160 research-based (independently led) credits.

1. Programme structure

- (a) The programme is available for study in both full-time and part-time modes.
- (b) The period of study for full-time mode shall be 1 year starting in September. The period of study for part-time mode shall normally be 2 years starting in September.
- (c) The MMus programme comprises modules to a credit value of 180. Both full-time and parttime candidates shall negotiate their studies with a supervisor such that their workload shall normally be divided as evenly as possible between the semesters of study, taking into account any taught modules they have selected as part of their programme of study.
