- (vi) All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.
- (vii) With the approval of the Degree Programme Director, and in exceptional circumstances, an alternative combination of modules that fall out with these regulations may be selected.

#### 5. Degree title

Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year shall be transferred onto the four year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1461U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in English Language and Literature (with Placement Year).

#### 6. Degree classification

- a) All Stage 2 and Stage 3 modules contribute towards the degree classification.
- b) Stage 2 and Stage 3 will be weighted in the ratio 1:2 in the final degree calculation.

#### 7. University Study Abroad and Exchange Programme

(a) Pending Degree Programme Director approval, students may take part in a semester abroad as listed in the School Undergraduate Handbook. The study abroad programme and the grades obtained are integral to the final degree. Students who take part in a semester abroad will be assigned one of the below modules codes. The grades gained whilst studying abroad will be suitably converted and the resulting mark will be used for their final degree classification.
