- (v) *A core module is a module which a student must pass, and in which a fail mark may neither be carried nor compensated; such modules are designated by the board of studies as essential for progression to a further stage of the programme or for study in a further module.*
- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning, distance learning or Blended.*

3. Year 3 (International Study Year)

- (a) Candidates may, subject to approval of the Degree Programme Director, undertake an International Study Year which would entail undertaking 120 credits over two semesters at an appropriate exchange partner institution.
- (b) Students can choose to undertake the programme upon completion of Stage 2 and prior to entering Stage 3. These candidates will be transferred to programme code 1625U.

4. Placement Year (Year 3)

- (a) On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates may as part of their studies for the degree spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year. These candidates will be transferred to programme code 1466U.

6. Assessment Methods

7. Degree Classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:2 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

8. Degree Title

Candidates who complete the three-year programme will graduate with a BA (Hons) in History.

Candidates who choose to take part in the International Study Year will be transferred onto the four-year versions of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1625U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in History with International Study Year.

Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year will be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1466U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in History (with Placement Year).
