- (ii) *All optional modules are offered subject to the constraints of the timetable and to any restrictions on the number of students who may be taught on a particular module. Not all modules may be offered in all years and they are listed subject to availability.*
- (iii) *Unless otherwise stated under 'Type', modules are not core.*
- (iv) *A compulsory module is a module which a student is required to study.*
- (v) *A core module is a module which a student must pass, and in which a fail mark may neither be carried nor compensated; such modules are designated by the board of studies as essential for progression to a further stage of the programme or for study in a further module.*
- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.*

3. Year 3 (Intercalating Year) – Year Abroad/Careers Service Placement Year

Candidates may opt to take an intercalating year between Stages 2 and 3, and spend a year studying abroad or on a placement year. Candidates who do not wish to take an intercalating year but want to study abroad may opt to spend a semester abroad by taking PHI3600 in the third stage of their degree – please see below for details.

Travel and study abroad will be guided by institutional and governmental policy at the time.

Year Abroad (1429U)

Candidates have the opportunity to transfer to 1429U BA Hons Philosophy (with Year Abroad) which involves a year of study in another country. This year abroad does not substitute for one year of study at Newcastle, but is in addition to the three years spent at Newcastle. In order to progress to Stage 3, students on 1429U must pass the following module:

Candidates who fail will be required to transfer to Stage 3 of V500.

Careers Service Placement Year (1434U)

On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates on the V500 Philosophy programme may, as part of their studies for the degree, spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation and transfer to 1434U. Candidates who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Candidates who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year.

Candidates who fail the module will be required to transfer to Stage 3 of V500.

Permission to undertake a placement or Erasmus exchange is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. It is the responsibility of individual candidates to make sure they meet the visa requirements of the country in which they plan to undertake a study/work placement. The University will withdraw the Tier 4 sponsorship for international students spending a year overseas. Once sponsorship is withdrawn, the Home Office will curtail the Tier 4 visa to 60 days. Candidates intending to return to the UK to complete their studies must apply for a new Tier 4 visa from their home country.

5. Assessment methods

6. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:1 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively.

The study abroad year (1429U) is assessed on a pass/fail basis and does not contribute to the degree classification.

The placement year (1434U) is assessed on a pass/fail basis and does not contribute to the degree classification.

7. Name of Award

Candidates who choose to take the intercalating year shall be transferred onto the four year version of the programme:

- Candidates who study abroad for one year will be transferred onto 1429U and will graduate with a BA (Hons.) in Philosophy (with Year Abroad)
- Candidates who undertake the placement year will be transferred onto 1434U and will graduate with a BA (Hons.) in Philosophy (with Placement Year)
