- (b) Candidates must select one Dissertation training module from the list below, they cannot take both modules. Candidates planning to take the Dissertation in Classics and Ancient History (CAC3000) in Stage 3 shall take Issues in Ancient History: Commentaries (CAH2208); candidates planning on taking the History dissertation (HIS3020) in Stage 3 shall take Crafting History (HIS2304).

### 3. Year 3 (Career Placement Year)

(a) On completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, candidates may as part of their studies for the degree spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year.

Permission to undertake a year abroad is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Students who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Students who fail Stage 2 may not complete a year abroad.

## 6. Assessment methods

Details of the assessment pattern for each module are set out in the Essential Module Information.

## 7. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for Honours performance on the basis of the assessment of all modules taken at Stage 2 plus all the modules taken at Stage 3. Assessment from Stage 3 counts for double that of Stage 2.

## 8. Degree Title

Candidates who complete the three-year programme will graduate with a BA (Hons) in Ancient History and History.

Candidates who choose to take part in the Career Placement year will be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1906U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in Ancient History and History (with Placement Year) so long as they pass their placement year.

Candidates who choose to take part in the Study Abroad year will be transferred onto the four-year version of the programme. They will be on degree programme code 1907U and will graduate with a BA (Hons) in Ancient History and History with International Study Year so long as they pass their Year abroad.

## 9. Appendix: Classical Languages Q800, Q810, QQ83 and V110

Students may choose to take one or more Classical Language modules as set out in their regulations. Depending on their level of previous study students will either start at Beginners or Intermediate level. Students must take the Semester 1 Part 1 module before proceeding to the Semester 2 Part 2 module. Pre-requisite modules are set out in the Module Outline forms and indicated below.

An exemption from the University's Qualifications and Credit Framework has been granted to allow the study of Beginners' and Intermediate Latin and Greek at any stage. In the cases of Stages 2 and 3, the particular pathway selected is subject to the discretion of the Degree Programme director.
