1. Programme structure

2. Semester of Exchange

- b. Permission to undertake a period of study abroad is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. It is the responsibility of the individual students to make sure they meet the visa requirements of the country in which they plan to undertake a period of study. - c. International students undertaking this option must be aware that the University will withdraw UK student (Tier 4) visas for the time spent overseas.
