### **3. Year 3 (Intercalating Year) (4 year programme only)**

- (a) Candidates who have passed all stage 1 and stage 2 modules at first or second attempt may, at the end of stage 2 and before entering stage 3, spend a year in a placement with an approved organisation as part of their studies for the degree or take part in a period of study abroad in one of the School's exchange partners or do a combination of both. Such candidates shall transfer to the relevant degree code reflecting the study abroad/ placement/ study abroad and placement activity that they complete and the language they

are studying. The transfer will take place once the student has successfully passed stage 2. All placement choices are subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. It is the responsibility of individual students to make sure they meet the visa requirements of the country in which they plan to undertake a study/work placement.

- (b) In making their choice, candidates must consider how the language they are studying will be developed during their intercalating year.
- Advanced French, Spanish, German students are required to complete their work placement or study abroad placement in a country that allows them to develop the language they are studying
  - Intermediate French, Spanish, German students are strongly recommended to complete a work or study abroad placement abroad in a country that allows them to develop the language they are studying
  - Intermediate and Advanced Chinese language are required to complete a study abroad placement in China
- (c) While studying at a partner institution during the Year Abroad your study programme will comprise a range of different modules that are either taught in the host language or in English. We would normally expect a minimum of 20% of your study load to be business-related modules that are delivered in the host language and/or host language courses that help you improve your language competency
- (d) Permission to undertake a placement or study abroad is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. It is the responsibility of the individual students to make sure they meet the visa requirement of the country in which they plan to undertake a study/work placement. Travel and study abroad will be guided by institutional and government guidance at the time.
- (e) The University **will** withdraw UK student (Tier 4) visas for international students spending a year overseas. It will then be the sole responsibility of the student to re-apply, in a timely fashion, for a UK student (Tier 4) visa to return to Newcastle to complete their studies.

## **6. Degree classification**

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the weighting of the stages being 1:2 for Stage 2 and Stage 3 respectively. The placement year will be assessed on a pass/fail basis and will not contribute to degree classification.

## **7. Name of Award**

- Candidates who choose to take the intercalating year with placement shall be transferred onto the appropriate four stage version of the placement programmes (code 1545U, 1534U, 1535U or 1536U) and will graduate with a BSc (Hons) International Business Management with [Name of Language] and Work Placement.
- Candidates who take the intercalating year with study abroad shall be transferred onto the appropriate four stage version of the study abroad programmes (code 1537U, 1538U, 1539U or 1540U) and will graduate with a BSc (Hons) International Business Management with [Name of Language] and Study Abroad.
- Candidates who take the intercalating year with placement and study abroad shall be transferred onto the appropriate four stage version of the study abroad and work placement programmes (code 1541U, 1542U, 1543U or 1544U) and will graduate with a BSc (Hons) International Business Management with [Name of Language] and Study Abroad and Work Placement.
