- (vii) *With the approval of the Degree Programme Director, and in exceptional circumstances, an alternative combination of modules that fall out with these regulations may be selected.*

5. Residence Abroad

Candidates are required to insert, between Stage 2 and Stage 4, a year spent in an approved German-speaking country, either pursuing a course of study at a university or other comparable institution, or undertaking an approved work placement. In exceptional circumstances, this requirement may be waived with permission by the Degree Programme Director.

6. Assessment methods

Details of the assessment pattern for each module are explained in the module outline.

7. Degree classification

(i) The marks from Stages 2 and 4 will contribute to the final classification of the degree.

- (ii) Stage 2 and Stage 4 will be weighted in the ratio 1:2 in the final degree calculation.
- (iii) If the mark gained in SML3006/3007/3008 at Stage 3 is equal to or greater than the average mark from modules taken at Stage 2 within the School of English Literature, Language and Linguistics, then the mark from the former will be substituted for the marks gained in the lowest 20 credits of modules taken with the School of English at Stage 2 when calculating the degree average and overall profile of marks.
