Notes

- (i) *These programme regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's Taught Programme Regulations.*
- (ii) *All optional modules are offered subject to the constraints of the timetable and to any restrictions on the number of candidates who may be taught on a particular module. Not all modules may be offered in all years, and they are listed subject to availability.*
- (iii) *Unless otherwise stated under 'Type', modules are not core.*
- (iv) *A compulsory module is a module which a candidate is required to study.*
- (v) *A core module is a module which a candidate must pass, and in which a fail mark may neither be carried nor compensated; such modules are designated by the Board of Studies as essential for progression to a further stage of the programme or for study in a further module.*
- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.*
- (vii) *Each Stage is made up of 120 credits. Candidates must ensure they choose a 60/60, 50/70 or 70/50 split of credits per semester.*

General Principles

1. Candidates can take one or two languages with International Relations, following one of the three pathways:
 - i. One or Two languages at post A-Level (see Section 1)
 - ii. Two languages, one at post A-Level, and one at Beginners level (see Section 2)
 - iii. One language at Beginners level (see Section 3)
2. Beyond Stage 1 candidates may not take up Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Portuguese or Spanish from Level A.
3. Candidates cannot take both Chinese and Japanese.
4. A candidate needs a minimum of 40 credits in each language for the language to be named on the degree certificate (either 40 credits of language OR 20 credits of language plus 20 credits of an option pertaining to the relevant language, e.g. CHN for Chinese, FRE options for French, GER options for German, JPN options for Japanese, POR for Portuguese, SPA for Spanish). Note that some LAS modules can count as the required 20 credits for Portuguese or Spanish but some only count for Spanish. Note that most SML-coded modules can count as the required 20 credits for any language.

5. Candidates should ensure they have an equal credit balance in each subject at all Stages but may request an 80/40 split in favour of SML modules in final year, subject to DPD approval.
6. The choice of all modules is subject to any pre-requisites.
7. Candidates are only permitted to take 20 credits of Level 4 modules in Stage 2.
8. Modules taken at Stage 1 cannot be repeated at Stage 2. Modules taken at Stage 2 cannot be repeated at Final Stage.
9. You may reduce to one language in Stage 2 and beyond, subject to DPD approval. You must take at least one language all the way through.
10. High-achieving candidates who have taken a Level B language at Stage 2 may be able to enter Level D of that language at final year with permission of the DPD. The relevant language module leader will make the initial assessment.

Section 1 – For candidates studying either a single language post A-Level (Level B) or two languages post A-Level (Level B)

1. Stage 1

Candidates doing two languages are expected to take 40 credits in each language. This means they will take a language plus an optional module for European languages and the language modules only for Chinese or Japanese. The remaining 40 credits will be made up of International Relations modules.

Candidates doing one language will need to take 60 credits of language and SML cultural modules and 60 credits of International Relations modules.

2. Stage 2

Candidates doing two languages are expected to take 40 credits in each language. This means they will take a language plus an optional module for European languages and the language module only for Chinese or Japanese. The remaining 40 credits will be made up of International Relations modules.

Candidates doing one language will need to take 60 credits of language and SML cultural modules and 60 credits of International Relations modules.

Non-attendance at the relevant briefings for this module may mean that candidates could be prevented from starting the Intercalating Year.

Candidates have the option to complete a Year Abroad between Stage 2 and final year. This decision is confirmed with the School of Modern Languages during Stage 2. Candidates who opt not to take a Year Abroad can choose one of the following options:

1. Transfer to 1942U BA (Hons) Modern Languages and International Relations (3-year programme) after completing Stage 2.
2. Transfer to 1943U BA (Hons) Modern Languages and International Relations (with Placement) after completing Stage 2.

The Degree Programme Director will approve the transfer in each case.

Optional Intercalating Year. See Section 4 below.

Final Year (Stage 4 for candidates taking a Year Abroad/Placement Year or Stage 3 for those not taking a Year Abroad/Placement Year)

Candidates doing two languages are expected to take 40 credits in each language. This means they will take a compulsory 20 credit language module plus an optional cultural module for European languages and the 40 credits of language modules only for Chinese or Japanese. The remaining 40 credits will be made up of International Relations modules.

Candidates doing one language can take an 80/40 split in favour of SML modules in final year, subject to DPD approval.

Section 4 – Optional Intercalating Year Abroad/Placement Year

Optional Intercalating Year Abroad

- (a) Candidates can opt to take a Year Abroad between Stage 2 and Stage 4 (final year). Candidates may spend the whole year in a country where one of their chosen languages is spoken or divide the year between countries in which their chosen languages are spoken. The year abroad can be spent pursuing courses of study at a partner university or other comparable institution, undertaking an approved work placement, or a combination of these (subject to the exception given in paragraph (b) below).
- (b) Candidates wishing to study Chinese or Japanese language at Stage 4 opting for a Year Abroad are required to spend either one semester or a complete academic year between Stage 2 and Stage 4 (final year) pursuing courses of study at a university or comparable institution China or Japan. An approved work placement is not an option for China or Japan. Candidates studying Chinese or Japanese with a European language who choose to spend a complete academic year in China or Japan are recommended to use summer vacations either side of their year abroad to visit French-, German-, Portuguese- or Spanish-speaking countries, where appropriate according to their other language(s) studied.
- (c) All candidates shall take the following compulsory module:

- (e) Candidates wishing to take a placement with an approved organisation will transfer to 1943U BA (Hons) Modern Languages and International Relations with Placement Year. Permission to undertake a placement is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director. Candidates who are required to re-sit their Stage 2 assessment must delay the start of their placement until they have done so. Candidates who fail Stage 2 may not complete a placement year.
- (f) The placement must be based in the UK or can be in the candidate's home country if they are not from the UK.
- (g) During their placement year, candidates are required to take the following module:

Section 5 – OTHER INFORMATION FOR ALL CANDIDATES

5. Assessment methods

Details of the assessment pattern for each module are explained in the module outline. A variety of methods are used: oral assessment; essays; unseen written examinations; in-course assessed work; on-line assessments; dissertation/project. Candidates may be awarded a Distinction as a result of their performance in the oral examination at Level D or in the oral examination at Level C (in Portuguese, Chinese or Japanese).

6. Degree classification

TL12 [4-year degree]: Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of results achieved in 260 credits across Stages 2, 3, and 4. At Stages 2 and 4, candidates must obtain marks for 120 credits; at Stage 3 (the intercalating year), 120 credits must be studied and passed, but only the mark gained for the 20-credit module (SML3006, SML3007, SML3008, SML3009 or SML3010) will count towards the degree. Modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 will be single-weighted and modules obtained at Stage 4 will be double-weighted. Stage 2 counts 28.54%, Stage 3 4.76% and Stage 4 66.7% towards the Final Degree Classification.

1942U [3-year programme]: Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of results achieved in 240 credits across Stages 2 and 3 (final year). Candidates must obtain marks in 120 credits in each of these Stages. Modules taken at Stage 2 will be single-weighted and modules

obtained at Stage 3 (final year) will be double-weighted. Stage 2 counts 33.3% and Stage 3 (final year) 66.7% towards the Final Degree Classification.

1943U [4-year with Placement]: Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of results achieved in 240 credits across Stages 2 and 3 (final year). Candidates must obtain marks in 120 credits in each of these Stages. Modules taken at Stage 2 will be single-weighted and modules obtained at Stage 3 (final year) will be double-weighted. Stage 2 counts 33.3% and Stage 3 (final year) 66.7% towards the Final Degree Classification. The placement year is assessed on a pass/fail basis but does not contribute to the degree classification.

7. Degree title

One language only:

Candidates studying on TL12 in one language will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [Name of language] and International Relations”. Those on 1942U will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [Name of language] and International Relations (3-year programme)” unless they study Chinese or Japanese in Stages 1 and 2, dropping language study at final year, in which case they will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [East Asian Studies] and International Relations (3-year programme)”. Those on 1943U will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [Name of language] and International Relations with Placement Year” unless they study Chinese or Japanese in Stages 1 and 2, dropping language study at final year, in which case they will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [East Asian Studies] International Relations with Placement Year”.

Two languages:

To qualify for the award of the degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages and International Relations with two named languages, a successful candidate must take two languages at both Stage 2 and final year; and in each of the two languages, the candidate must take 40 credits (by a combination of compulsory language and language-specific optional modules) at Stage 2 and at final year. Candidates on TL12 will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [Names of languages] and International Relations” and those on the 1942U will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [Names of languages] and International Relations (3-year programme)”. Those on 1943U will be awarded the “Degree of BA with Honours in Modern Languages [Names of languages] and International Relations with Placement Year”.

8. Exemptions

The Bachelor of Arts in Modern Languages and International Relations has been granted the following exemption from the University Regulations:
