Notes

- (ii) *All optional modules are offered subject to the constraints of the timetable and to any restrictions on the number of students who may be taught on a particular module. Not all modules may be offered in all years and they are listed subject to availability.*
- (iii) *Unless otherwise stated under 'Type', modules are not core.*
- (iv) *A compulsory module is a module which a student is required to study.*
- (v) *A core module is a module which a student must pass, and in which a fail mark may neither be carried nor compensated; such modules are designated by the board of studies as essential for progression to a further stage of the programme or for study in a further module.*
- (vi) *All modules are delivered in Linear mode unless stated otherwise as Block, eLearning or distance learning.*

3. Year Abroad

- (a) Students may with the permission of the Degree Programme Director, at the end of stage 2 and before entering stage 3, spend a year abroad with one of our partner institutions as part of the degree. To qualify for the year abroad, students will need to meet a threshold of at least 60% in the first three semesters of study. All candidates shall take the following compulsory module:

- (b) It is the responsibility of individual students to make sure they meet the visa requirements of the country in which they plan to undertake a year abroad. Travel and study abroad will be guided by institutional and governmental policy at the time.
- (c) The University **will** withdraw UK student (Tier 4) visas for International students spending a year overseas. It will then be the sole responsibility of the student to re-apply in a timely fashion, for a UK student (Tier 4) visa to return to Newcastle to complete their studies.

- (a) All candidates must take **one** Major Specialist Study from this list:

5. Assessment methods

6. Degree classification

Candidates will be assessed for degree classification on the basis of all the modules taken at Stages 2 and 3 with the modules at stage 2 counting as one third and the modules at stage 3 counting as two thirds of the final total weighting.

7. Degree Title

Candidates who do not take part in the Year Abroad will be transferred onto the three-year programme. They will be transferred to W300 and will graduate with a Bachelor of Music with Honours in Music.

Candidates who choose to take part in the Placement Year rather than the Year Abroad, will be transferred to degree programme 1669U and will graduate with a Bachelor of Arts with Honours in Music (with Placement Year)
